Our lovely historic Friendship Quilt is 100 years old! This quilt was made by the Ladies Aid Society of the Methodist Church in 1914 and raffled off in a fund raiser in 1915. It was signed by 100 of the first residents of the town of Fort Lupton, and is registered with the Colorado Historical Society. Over the years, we have had many people request to see and photograph the quilt as a part of their family histories. These visitors have come from all over the country. We now have a very nice case, donated by the City, in which to display the quilt full time.

We just recently received a very large and wonderful charcoal drawing of the Museum. The drawing was created by a former art teacher from the Middle School and several of his students.

This year, the Museum is looking forward to several remodeling projects. We are hoping to have the upstairs interior painted, the floors refinished, new window coverings, and basement bathrooms remodeled.

Last but not least we will be holding our 3rd Annual Ice Cream Social and Open House, September 6th from 11:00am to 2:00pm.

Police Blotter

Since I started with the City of Fort Lupton in February of 2010, I have had several people ask me why the Police Department is involved in so many functions that are not law enforcement related. We are involved in every celebration that the City helps with and usually in more than a security function. In fact, in 2011 the Police Department planned and ran the Trapper's Day event. We cook for our senior citizens, help to organize food distribution, assist at the food bank, work with the Family Resource Center, and help out in a myriad of other community events.

Part of this comes from our motto "Find a way to help", which was here when I came. I also believe that the more community members know one another, work and play together, the less crime will happen. I would rather have officers preventing crime than investigating it. Preventing criminal activity is just as important as teaching folks how to not be a victim. It's less expensive than building bigger fences, installing stronger locks, or cleaning up after the carnage of crime.

This last month the U.S. Department of Justice confirmed my beliefs. In a report entitled: *New Tools for Community Involvement and Crime Control*, the researchers found that "the majority of crime control actually results from the everyday activities of citizens". They also found that the more social cohesion a community has, the more they can assist in crime reduction and crime prevention. There appears to be a direct correlation between "the way people interact, share common goals and values and trust one another, and the level of crime".

National Night Out is August 5th this year. I hope to see you all at the park across from the Police Department that night for a time filled with fun, food, and fellowship. Please get out and meet your neighbors and get involved in our great little city. At your service.

38th Annual Fort Lupton Trapper Days Booth and Vendor Application Available

The Fort Lupton Trapper Days Committee is seeking booths and vendors for the upcoming Trapper Days scheduled for the weekend of September 5-7, 2014. Booths and vendors will be located on Denver Avenue and available to the public all day on Saturday, September 6, 2014, immediately following the Trapper Days Parade. Booths will need to be dismantled by 5:30 pm on the 6th.

This year's theme is "The Fort Lupton Tapestry: A Beautiful Blend of Past, Present and People!" Booths and vendors are encouraged to follow the theme of this year's event.

Booths are encouraged from non-profit, youth-related groups, businesses seeking to promote their business, and food vendors. Non-profit informational and youth-related groups will not have to pay a fee. Non-profit sales groups will be charged \$20 for their booth. Business, food or information, along with non-food vendor sales, will be charged \$30 for their booth space. The Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment has specific requirements which all food vendors must comply with for this event. Further food information is available by calling the department at 970-304-6415 or visiting their website. The sale of knives, firearms, illegal weapons or fireworks of any type is strictly prohibited.

All booths are 12' x 12' and operators are expected to supply their own tables, chairs, display equipment, power, and overhead covering.
