### **City of Fort Lupton COVID-19 Update**

From November 6th through the 15th, Fort Lupton's City Hall was closed to the public due to 5 employees testing positive for COVID-19. The City of Fort Lupton notified Weld County Health Department and is now classified by the state as an active COVID-19 outbreak. An active COVID-19 outbreak is defined as having two or more people with confirmed cases of COVID-19 within a workplace/facility, with onset within 14 days.

City staff were already beginning to operate at Colorado's Level Red which is operating City offices at 10% capacity as well as high-risk employees staying home, other changes made included returning to remote working, limited in-person presence by City staff and general public, offsetting shifts, and virtual meetings.

As always, the City did and will continue to provide essential services to its residents and businesses. This includes public safety, water utilities, and emergency response services. City staff is dedicated to continuing to work with the Weld County Health Department and the State of Colorado in reporting cases and providing information as needed. City Hall will remain on the active outbreak list until 28 days pass without any new cases.

Fort Lupton's leadership team will continue to implore employees and the community to continuously be proactive and preventative in their health.
